

Activities

- 1) Play a D major scale to get your fingers warmed up, ready for some pie!
- 2) Clap and sing the note names of bars 1 to 10, and bars 13 to 20, then play them.
- 3) Play the piece as a duet with someone else playing Part A Listen carefully to their dynamics as you play.

Activities

- Clap and sing the note names of bars 3 to 10, and bars 11 to 20, then play them.

- Play the piece as a duet with someone else playing Part A. Listen carefully to their dynamics as you play.
